A-203 Pricing Order for Mainstream Chicken

To: All Processors & Growers

The British Columbia Chicken Marketing Board orders as follows:

1. The minimum prices to be paid by Processors to Growers for chicken marketed in the province of British Columbia on all product contracted for or otherwise designated by the Board to be shipped in the Period A-203 (June 28, 2026 – August 22, 2026) shall be as follows:

2. All prices are f.o.b. farm.
3. This order shall remain in effect until rescinded, varied, or amended by further order of the Board.
4. The targeted weight shall be as specified in the contract.
5. Tolerance on a flock is plus or minus 6% from targeted weight.
6. If the flock average weight falls within targeted weight tolerances (i.e., weight range plus or minus 6%) but the average weight is in a different category, the price payable will be determined by the average weight delivered.

Note: The Board by way of motion on July 17, 2025, after consulting with the processors and growers agreed to make a correction to the live price over approximately 6 periods. The Board reserves the right to apply across more or less than 6 periods, as required. Adjustments have been made to the live price for 6 periods: A-197 (\$0.01), A-198 (\$0.013), A-199 (\$0.013), A-200 (\$0.013), A-201 (\$0.013) and A-202 (\$0.013). There will be no adjustment for quota period A-203 to allow the Board time to finalize and audit the production numbers for A-202 and determine if/or how much any final error correction is required for one additional period in the future.

1. The BC COP formula is as follows:

$$(a) \text{ Operating Costs} + (b) \text{ Labour} + (c) \text{ Capital Costs} = \text{COP}$$

2. Reminder

Effective period A-202, catching costs have been permanently removed from the BC live price COP formula. The Board has been advised by BC Processors that currently the catching cost is \$0.05/kg live weight. The rate will be periodically updated as required and may or may not reflect the actual catching rate.
